Worked Republic of India Award

Issued by the Amateur Radio Society of India for contacting stations in India, the Laccadive Is. and the Andaman and Nicobar Is on 1.8 to 28 Mhz including WARC bands) on CW, AM, SSB or RTTY since 26 Jan 1950.

A minimum of 100 points is needed: QSO's with mainland India on 1.8 Mhz - 3 points, on 3.5 and 7 Mhz = 2, and on 14 to 28 Mhz = 1.

Contacts with stations using special prefixes count an additional point. With Laccadive and Andaman, the point value is 5 on 1.8 Mhz, 4 on 3.5 and 7 Mhz, and 3 on other bands.
